The 19th International Symposium of Historical Theology, on the 25th anniversary of John Paul II's encyclical on ecumenism, will have as its theme **"Ut unum sint: the Irrevocable Journey of the Church".** The event, which will be held in Valencia, has been jointly organized by the Yves Congar' Chair of the Faculty of Theology San Vicente Ferrer and the Institute of Ecumenical Studies of the Pontifical University of St. Thomas Aquinas in Rome (ANGELICUM), with the collaboration of the Facoltà Teologica dell'Italia Meridionale, sezione San Luigi.

The Symposium, a space for reflection, meeting, dialogue and study, will be held in two stages and two different locations. In Valencia, reflection will focus on the achievements and challenges of the journey towards visible unity: the Encyclical **Ut unum sint** will allow participants to address theological, ecclesiological, historical and pastoral issues. In Naples, during the second stage, inspired by Pope Francis' call, it will promote the *theology of the Mediterranean*, as theology of inter-religious and intercultural encounter and dialogue.

• All requests must be sent by email to

simposioth@teologiavalencia.es. The subject title should be: (insert author's name) Communication Proposal.

• The file format must be .doc, .docx or .rtf. It must also be written in single space without headers or footers (except numbering) and in Times New Roman 14 font in A4 size.

• The file must contain: the author's name and surname and (if it is the case) his/her institutional connection. Contact information, telephone, e-mail and postal address. The title of the communication must also be included, as well as the Abstract (maximum 400 words) and Keywords.

• Confirmation: all people who send the application will receive acknowledgment of receipt within a week. If not, please contact the above e-mail address.

• Deadline: 31th May 2021.

• Acceptance communication: the Program Committee's decision will be notified before the 20th June 2021. The authors whose communication has been accepted commit to sending the full text of communication by e-mail (maximum 4.500 words) with the bibliography before the 30th September 2021. The authors who present their communication will be given an accrediting certificate and will be able to present it in public within the symposium program. The Program Committee reserves the right to select the communications to be published in the proceedings of the Symposium.
